List of loveliness

So with this in mind, take the time to think about the things constantly haunting your mind - events you wished hadn't happened, or you'd not done. Anything you feel

regretful about in some form or another. Write them out in a list. Now, just for fun, look at them in a new light. Assume each situation wasn't a mistake, and ask yourself:

- What good has come from it?
- What have I learnt about myself?
- How has it helped me in the world?
- How have these experiences served me?
- How has this made me approach life in a good way?
- What strengths have I gained from this situation in my life?

Look at your answers, and notice how you feel? When I perceive life in this way, I

often start feeling very empowered. You can't feel like you're a victim of the circumstances in your life when you can clearly recognise and appreciate the gift in each situation you encounter. If you do this enough, you'll soon begin to view your world in a new and healthier way.
